Learning outcomes

- (NVCI) **Identify** a range of nonverbal communications methods, e.g. facial expression, tones of voice, symbols, clothing, colours to signal mood/appropriate action
- (NVC2) **Use** appropriate nonverbal behaviour in communication a simple idea, e.g. disappointment or joy, tone of voice to seek/assistance/complain
- (NVC3) **Relay a response or request** nonverbally, e.g. hitching a lift, signalling a phone call
- (NVC4) **Respond** to nonverbal signal and signs encountered in daily life, e.g. road signs, traffic signs, hazardous materials
- (NVC5) Follow the sequence of nonverbal instructions or directions for a frequent activity, e.g. using household equipment with three or more operations, putting a battery in a toy, finding safety exits/following fire-drill






Your voice




Signs and symbols

Body language around the world


Body language can be different around the world.
