



Craft processes - Cutting techniques

Complete the sentences:

2. Use rotary cutters, where necessary. They are extremely so be sure to cut away from yourself, never
toward yourself.
3. Smooth out your before you cut it.
4. If your fabric is wrinkled or creased, take the time to it.
5. If you're using a pattern, cut it out on the outside lines before you it to the fabric. Don't try to cut the pattern out of tissue or paper at the same time you're cutting out the fabric.
6. Don't lift the pattern and fabric off your work surface when you're with scissors. Instead, try to run your scissors close to the work surface to prevent distorting the pattern and stretching the fabric.
7. Before you actually start cutting into your fabric, make sure all of your pieces are laid out correctly.
8. Make sure your pins and are sharp! Dull pins can be damaging on more delicate fabrics, and sharp scissors make

a big difference in the accuracy of your cutting.

Sewing Machine

Use a sewing machine.

Test the stitch on a scrap of fabric.

 \square Keep the bulk of the fabric to the left of the needle at all times.

Insert the fabric from the front and then lower the presser foot.

DLower the needle with the hand wheel.

 \square Begin machining by pressing lightly on the foot pedal.

 \square Guide the fabric towards the machine. Do not push or pull.


If you need to stop in the middle of a line or to turn a corner, leave the needle in the fabric.

 \square At the end of a line, reverse for a few stitches.

 \square Raise the needle and lift the presser foot.

 \square Pull the fabric to the back and cut the thread.
